While DECA needs the Chamber of Commerce, the Chamber also needs DECA.

Action Steps for Success

1. Contact the local Chamber of Commerce to set-up a meeting with the Executive Director or Membership Director to discuss opportunities for partnership.
2. During meeting be sure to identify opportunities for the DECA chapter to assist the Chamber. Examples may include: assisting at special Chamber events, DECA members serving on Chamber committees, hosting a Chamber networking event, etc.
3. Select a specific DECA member to serve as the chapter's liaison to the Chamber of Commerce to maximize communication and establish a strong relationship.
4. Regularly attend chamber meetings and always look for additional opportunities to strengthen the partnership.
